

AUSTRIAN PINE

Pinus nigra

Austrian Pine, *Pinus nigra*, is a native of Europe and is one of the most adaptable evergreen conifers available today. It is the most tolerant of the pines to urban conditions. Its crown takes on a oval, spreading and open form rather than the typical pyramidal shape of most pines.

It is one of the best pines to tolerate winter salt spray making it one of the best choices to plant near a roadway. It is good for single plantings or in a mass planting for screening or windbreak purposes. It is highly susceptible to Diplodia tip blight and should never be planted in a total Austrian Pine monoculture
